He is currently a Professor at the Graduate School of Social and Cultural Studies at Kyushu University, after working as a Research Assistant at Yamaguchi University and then as an Assistant Professor at College of General Education, Kyushu University. He is also a program leader of GIPAD (Graduate Program of Interdisciplinary Policy Analysis Design), which is an interdisciplinary issue-solving educational program for Kyushu University students. His main research focuses on the group process, the mechanism which connects free interaction at the individual level and system at the social level, paying attention to social dilemmas, roles, social capital, urbanization and social stratification.
